BISHOP FELTON EDWIN MAY
1935 - 2017

Elected to the episcopacy in 1984, he was assigned to the Harrisburg (Pennsylvania) Area. In 1996, he became the first African-American bishop of the Baltimore-Washington Conference, where he served until 2004. A tireless advocate for civil rights, social justice, and educational opportunity, he led efforts to combat substance abuse, violence, and poverty, and played an active role in fighting the effects of the global AIDS epidemic. A forceful preacher and pioneer of a remarkable array of mission initiatives, he touched the lives of many.
